Re: World War I Education Packets Available from Neville Public Museum

Green Bay, WI— The Neville Public Museum has completed its education packet for World War I. This packet includes 18 lesson plans on the War including *Creating a Trench Scope*, *Food Problems*, *Influenza Cards*, *4 Minute Men Speeches* and *Green Bay-Press Gazette Articles Debate*, the latter of which includes historic newspaper clippings from the era. Teachers will find the packet helpful in that each lesson plan includes academic standards, a procedure sheet, handouts and links to helpful websites.

Teachers can request the packet by contacting the Curator of Education, Matt Welter, at 920-448-7851 or at Welter_MT@co.brown.wi.us. The education packet is in Adobe Acrobat™ and is 4MB. It can also be downloaded directly from the museum's website, www.nevillepublicmuseum.org.

The packet is supplemental pre/post visit material for the upcoming exhibit, *The Traitor State: Wisconsin in World War I*, which will be on display from February 9 – August 17, 2008. Guided and self-guided tours of the exhibit will be available to school groups for \$1 per person (students, teachers, chaperones, bus drivers, etc). Every student who attends a school tour will receive a packet of WWI cards with reproductions of WWI posters from the Neville Public Museum collection on one side and a relevant WWI activity (such as slang, Morse Code or food rationing) on the other.
