Discover Local Lighthouses in *Safe Harbor: Lighthouses of Green Bay* at the Neville Public Museum

Safe Harbor: Lighthouses of Green Bay is a brand new exhibit on the museum's second floor mezzanine. The exhibit features historic photographs of lighthouses in Green Bay from the Neville Public Museum's collection, as well as recent photographs taken by lighthouse enthusiast George McCourt.

Safe Harbor also features an eight-foot tall scale model of the 1848 Long Tail Point lighthouse, three Fresnel lens models, as well as two original lighthouse keeper logs from the Grassy Island Lighthouse. Visitors to the exhibit will also be able to download a smartphone app that will extend the exhibit beyond the museum and allow visitors to navigate to the physical locations of the lighthouses.
